



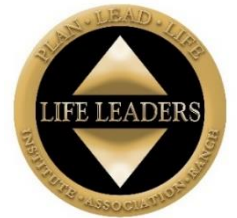
Compassion Ranch

4. Lou aka Twister: Quarter Horse 2014, rescued by Sheriff, 2x2, Triple D 5/2020
5. July aka Janis-July: Shetland Pony circa 2005, rescue by Two by Two, Triple D 5/2020
6. Spirit: Quarter Horse, 2017, rescued by Triple D/Stone 2019
7. Storm: Quarter Horse, 2018, rescued by Triple D/Stone 2019
8. Cody: Quarter Horse, circa 2003, DDD boarded 2017 after Francis and Jean Bryant died
9. Katie aka Princess: circa 2010, boarded 2017 Steve & Pam Bryant after Francis and Jean died
10. Star: Quarter Horse, Star of the Bar: 2003, DDD 2007
11. Patriot aka American Patriot, Morgan Horse, Anakus Flynn: 2001, DDD 2007
12. Indy aka Indian Legend: Paint, 2008, born to mare rescued from "kill pen", DDD 2008

13. June: aka Granny, circa 2000, rescued after owner died, DDD 2010
14. Jill: circa 2010, rescued after owner died, DDD 2010
15. Honk: circa 2000, boarded 2017 after previous farm owners Francis and Jean Bryant died

16. Cowgirl: Australian Shepherd/Border Collie, 2014, abandoned/rescued 2015 DDD
17. Lady Bug: Jack Russell-Feist, circa 2010, abandoned/rescued/fostered 2015 DDD
18. Buck: Pyrenees/Retriever, 2015, surrendered at Chilton County Shelter/adopted 2015 DDD
19. Chief: Shepherd, 2018, abandoned, rescued Christmas 12/2018 DDD
20. Annie (Annie Oakley): Shepherd, 2018, abandoned/homeless 2019, rescued 2/2020 DDD
21. Rambo: Husky/American Bull Dog, circa 2018, tied to tree in woods 3 days, rescued 9/2020 DDD
22. Cowboy: Husky/Australian Shepherd, circa 2018, rescued 12/2020
23. Emergency fosters care: many more have stayed here for hours or days preparing for foster care.
